Glenn Ladd is a 35 year veteran of law enforcement. After retiring at the rank of Major from the Overland Park, Kansas Police Department in 2002, he has been the Chief of Police of the North Kansas City Missouri Police Department for over six years.

Chief Ladd holds a Bachelors of Fine Arts degree from Northwest Missouri State University and a Masters of Science degree from Central Missouri State University. He is a graduate of the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar (44th LEEDS) and the 138th Session of the FBI National Academy. Chief Ladd was selected as the first FBI Leadership Fellow in 2000. He taught leadership topics at the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia in the Leadership Development Unit, for nine months. During his assignment, he also presented at the International Police Academy in Budapest, Hungary.

Chief Ladd has presented a variety of Leadership related topics at Regional Command Colleges, Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminars, FBI Offices, and Police Departments in the United States. He has also presented internationally at the Durham Region Leadership Seminar, for the Ontario Provincial Police Leadership Seminar in Toronto, Canada, and Leadership Training for Constables of the University of Toronto Police Service.

He has been a college instructor since 1980, in such topics as Criminology, Forensic Science, Police Organization and Management, Criminal Justice Systems, Police Community Relations, Criminal Law and Constitutional Law. He continues to teach at the Johnson County Community College, in Overland Park, Ks., in the Administration of Justice Program.
